The total number of calls for service was 6083, which includes 5927 traditional calls and 156 online crime reports (figure 1). There were 488 Priority 1 (emergency) calls, followed by 1,190 (P2), 2,915 (P3), and 1,297 (P4). Online crime reports are not assigned a priority classification but the nature of these files commonly reflect P3 and P4. Given that a single case (GO) can have 1-4 Uniform Crime Report (UCRs) codes applied, we see that the true measure of incidents in 2025 is 7,595 UCRs, which is a -2.0% decrease from 2024's 7752 UCRs. UCRs are essentially a measure of how many incidents occurred within a single file (e.g., a single GO for car accident may include 2 UCRs, one for collision, and one for excessive speeding).

- ❖ Frequency of incidents (UCRs) decreased in 2025.
- ❖ There was a total of 6083 calls for service (including online crime reports).
- ❖ Priority 1 calls increased marginally from 479 to 488.

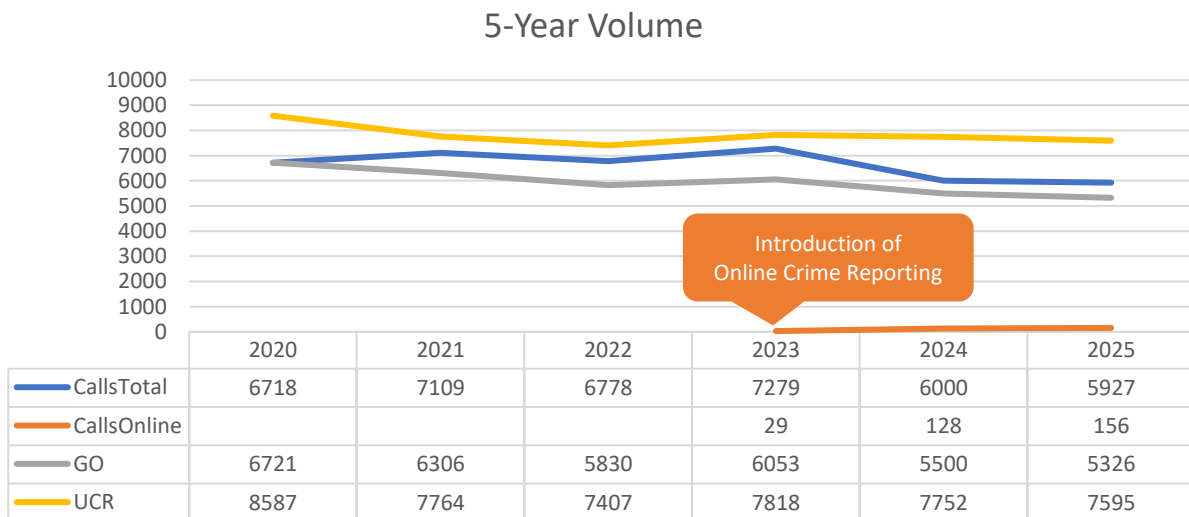

Why do numbers sometimes change? Retrospective statistics are updated annually to account for changes due to final outcomes of investigations, delayed reporting of historical crimes, updates to data gathering methodologies, and changes to legal classifications of offences (i.e., decriminalization of certain drugs or the introduction of new laws).

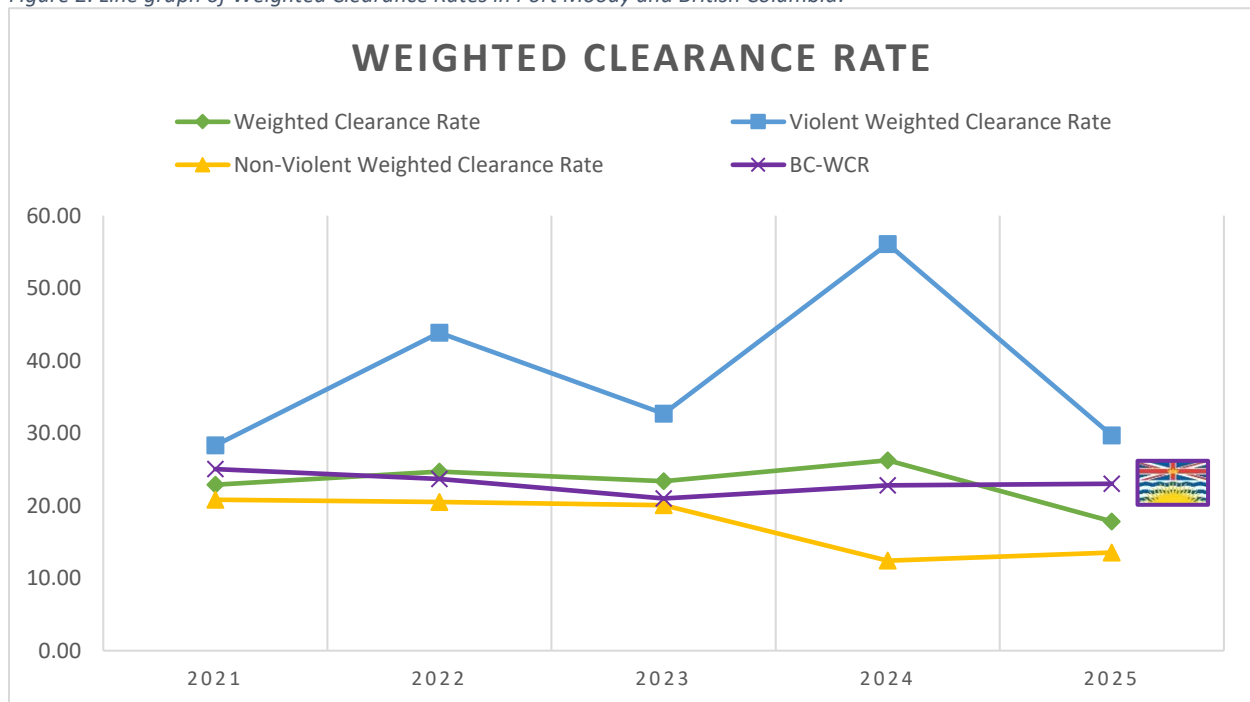
6 Weighted Clearance Rates

A weighted clearance rate measures the proportion of reported crimes solved by police, adjusted for the severity and frequency of each offense.

The range of scores for the overall weighted clearance rate for Port Moody remains similar or above other cities in British Columbia.

7 Crime Severity Index

The Crime Severity Index (CSI) is a measure of police-reported crimes, based on the volume and seriousness of offence; crimes with longer average sentences are given heavier weights, thus a higher score represents an increase in severity of crime over time.

The city of Port Moody continues to enjoy one of the lowest CSI rates in the region, but it is notable that in the past five years, the ratings have both increased and decreased with great margins. This is due to how a single serious offence can greatly swing our violent-CSI ranking.
